- Available to classroom teachers at North Lawrence Community Schools, Mitchell Community Schools, St. Vincent de Paul Catholic School, Lawrence County Independent Schools, and Springville Community Academy.\*
- Grant amounts range from \$50 to \$500.
- Applications will be accepted online through Wednesday, September 13, 2023,
- Grants will be awarded in November.
- A Final Report will be due by the end of the school year.



## Please Note:

Grants dollars cannot be used to reimburse for items purchased prior to receipt of your grant or any taxes you may incur.

\*Schools must be accredited by the state of Indiana and be located in and serve Lawrence County, Indiana, to participate.

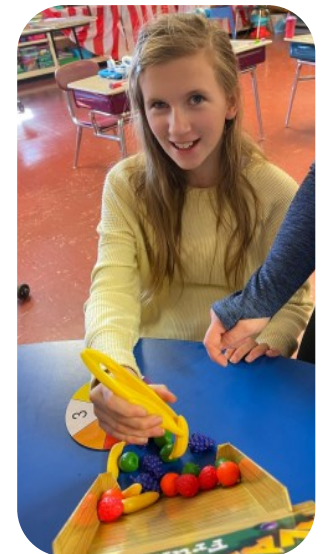


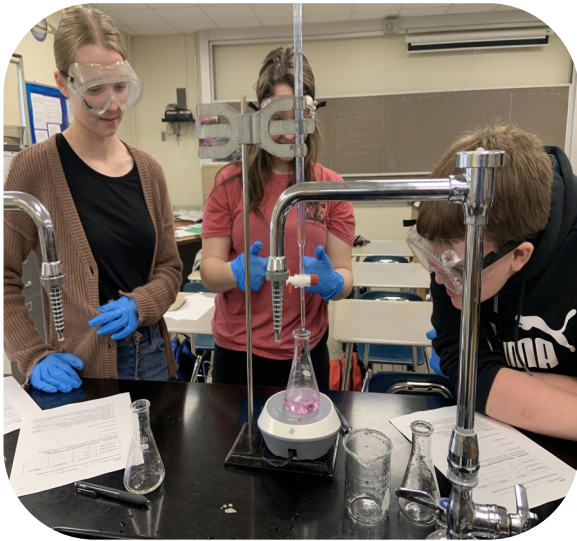

# Previous Grants

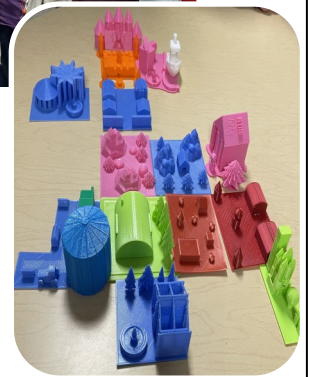
**Counting our Spring Chickens:** Students built a chicken coop, nurtured eggs until they hatched, and are now raising chickens. Students are learning about engineering for optimization, life cycles, caring for living things, and eliminating food waste through composting and gardening.



**Learning to Teach and Teaching to Learn Through Puppetry:** As part of an Early Childhood Education dual credit curriculum, students learn how to teach language, literacy, and social emotional skills to young children. Through this grant, students learned how to teach these skills using puppets with pre-school students.



**Theme Park Design:** Middle school students created a theme park. They developed a story and theme and considered the land required to house their park. Each student designed a unique attraction for the park and created a 3D model of their structure.



**Energy, Waves, Forces, Oh My!** Students learning about energy, waves, forces, molecules, and earth's systems were able to experience hands on activities reinforcing these lessons. In a real life simulation students were able to apply their knowledge in advising a local resident to use solar panels as a renewable energy option.
